 - Agenda/Minutes for Planning Committee, Wednesday, 24th April, 2019, 5.30 pm
 - DCC response to reporting. Correspondence for the whole of the Parish can be addressed to the Highways Hub e-mail address highways.hub@derbyshire.gov.uk. With regard to manhole covers, responsibility for some of them may be identifiable on the actual cover to enable you to report the problem directly to the relevant utility company if they are for example loose/rattling. Alternatively you could report them for investigation to either the Highways Hub, on the 'Do It Now' web form via the Derbyshire County Council website www.derbyshire.gov.uk or to Call Derbyshire on 01629 533190. Where a manhole poses an immediate highway safety concern, for example collapsed manhole or missing/dislodged cover, then this should be reported to Call Derbyshire on the above telephone number. Derbyshire County Council will then carry out a risk assessment and if necessary, interim action can be taken to reduce risk for highway users.
 - Verges Farm footpath. Further to your enquiry in relation to the above I am writing to confirm that a Public Inquiry is to be held to determine the Order at Ilkeston Town Hall, the Inquiry is scheduled to last for three days commencing on Tuesday 10 September 2019 at 10.00am.
 - DCC response to concerns reported. I write with reference to your enquiry regarding various issues in Dale Abbey area; I apologise for the delay in replying. The Parish is split between two different inspection areas and therefore, my response is in relation to investigations carried out by the Highway Inspector for Cat and Fiddle Lane. The Inspector advises the reactive pothole repairs are completed. With regard to the manhole covers, these issues were reported to Severn Trent Water and as of 3 April, 2019 it is understood one of the covers has received repair however, our Street Works Inspector has chased other work up with Severn Trent. Other issues regarding the signs mentioned in your e-mail below, are currently being followed up with the relevant Highway Inspector for the area.

 - Sign Obscured - Cross Lea, Dale Abbey DCC ref F560579 SBS 35816846 Further to your report on 5 April 2019 regarding the above, the highway inspector has visited this location and found that the junction sign here was not obstructed, therefore, no further action will be taken. If you could provide some photos of the obstruction then the highway inspector will investigate further.
 - Latest Spotlight newsletter released from the Police and Crime Commissioner - Issue 7 Spring 2019
 - Response from DCC/Councillor Hart further to parishioner question at last meeting. You were asked by a parishioner about changing the priority at the junction of the Village with Arbour Hill/Moor Lane,, officers have responded as following:-To install a STOP sign requires changing the junction from a 'Giveaway' type junction to a STOP type junction and can only be done after approval is given by the Secretary of State for Transport where we would have to prove visibility in both directions is virtually nil, other things considered are how highly trafficked both roads are, how high the speed limit is on the road traffic is turning out of, have there been any collisions which have occurred as a result of visibility issues by vehicles turning out of the Village. Although they acknowledge that visibility from the right is not good, visibility from the left is fine, it does go on into some detail but at the end they are saying that they would not want to proceed with this.
